All Hands On Deck

"All Hands On Deck" can be traced back to early naval history when a ship was in a moment of crisis and everyone was needed to help. Now, our church is not experiencing a crisis per se, but there should always be a priority placed on our mission and outreach along with securing the future of our church. Just like on a ship everyone has a job to do but it isn't the same job. If it was nothing would get done. In the church we all have a job to do, it's finding that niche that is difficult for some people.

As Christians whenever we are out in our community we represent the church whether it is in a church related function or a non-related event. In 2018 Busti Federated Church supported several organizations as well as community based events. Some of these include:

Love INC: We have just completed a special collection of baby supplies but will continue collecting cleaning, sanitation, health and beauty supplies throughout the year. There are also many ways to volunteer directly through the organization.

Blue Star Mothers: All year long we collect items that are packaged and sent to active duty military at Christmas and Easter. To help you can donate items, help pack boxes and donate to help cover the cost of shipping.

St. Susan's Center - St. Susan's serve over 100,000 meals yearly to the needy that live in and around Jamestown. They are always looking for volunteers to serve, especially during holidays. They also have many fundraising events throughout the year.

UCAN City Mission - Formerly know as the Union Gospel Mission UCAN is an adult male rescue mission seeking to serve "the least, the last and the lost" by providing a safe place to live, life skills training, healthcare and hygiene, local church connection, accountability and recovery. Financial support is one of their greatest needs as well as volunteers.

Wreaths Across America - Every year on the 3rd Saturday of December wreaths are laid at the graves of veterans. This is a national event and in Jamestown it takes place at Lakeview Cemetery. The cost is \$15.00 to sponsor a wreath but more than that being at the event to help place the wreaths shows support to those that have served and are serving. About 1,200 wreaths are needed to cover each grave at Lakeview's Soldiars Circle but each year we are only able to raise around 500 wreaths. This year we would like to reach that 1,200 goal and you can help by sponsoring a wreath or by helping spread the word to sell wreaths.

Did you know???

The lowest point in Busti is where Stillwater creek crosses into Kiantone. That low point, and all of Busti, are higher than any point in the states of Delaware, Illinois, Indiana, Louisiana, Mississippi and Rhode Island.

The Geographic center of Busti is west of Shadyside Road and the antipode, the opposite side of the world, is not in China. It is 1,000 miles southwest of Perth, Australia in the Indian Ocean.

The founder of the Goodrich Company, Benjamin Franklin Goodrich, was born in Ripley, NY and is buried in Jamestown Lakeview Cemetery. Goodrich reached a licensing agreement with Charles Goodyear and bought the Hudson River Rubber Company in partnership with J.P. Morris in 1869. The company, located in Melrose, New York, failed. The following year he accepted an offer of \$13,600 from the citizens of Akron, Ohio to relocate his business there. He founded Goodrich, Tew & Co. in 1870. Goodrich bought out Tew, and in 1880 the company became the B.F. Goodrich Company. Benjamin Goodrich was the first in Akron to own a telephone, which was a gift from Alexander Graham Bell in 1877. The telephone connected Goodrich's house on Quaker Street to his factory on Rubber Street.

Parsonage Update

Rifle Stamps Ticket To NCAA Championships

WEST POINT - After a program record setting performance in its NCAA qualification match on Saturday, the Army West Point rifle team has qualified to compete at the NCAA Championships.

This marks the first time that Army has qualified for the event as a team since the 2013-14 season.

"We are all pretty excited to make the NCAAs this year," head coach <u>Web Wright</u> said. "The team really came together when it counted and they should be really proud about that."

The event will take place in Morgantown, W.V., beginning on March 8th, with five participants being designated from each team. Eight additional participants from non-qualifying teams have also been selected to bring the total number of participants to 48. The top four scores from each team will be counted towards the championship total.

Selection for the NCAA Championships was determined by taking the average of the team's three highest aggregate point totals of the season and adding it to the team's program record setting score from the NCAA Qualification Match on Feb. 16. The Black Knight's point total has earned them the seventh seed.

"We set a program record last Saturday, but I know we have more in us," Wright said. "I am really looking forward to this."

Before heading to Morgantown, the Black Knights will participate in the Great America Rifle Conference Championship in Akron, Ohio, on February 22 and 23.

"We are headed out to our conference championships on Thursday and look to that as a sort of practice match to get ready." Wright said.

Congratulations to Clayton Hanson on his continued success at West Point Military Academy and as a member of their rifle team.

2019 Treasurer's Report

The following is my 2019 Treasurer's Report. Financially after all of our bills were paid and contributions made we had a small surplus of \$296.49. We have funds designated for the Roof, Memorials and Whitt Fund but there are no extra funds to fall back on in case of emergency. Also, we are proposing to keep the budget the same as 2018 with the understanding that there may be some changes throughout the year in regards to the ongoing attempt to sell the parsonage. As of the writing of this report the parsonage is now empty and we have switched the gas bill back to the church. We will monitor our income and expenses as usually and make any appropriate changes in expenditures as needed.
