#### Thoughts About the Cross

The events surrounding the crucifixion of Jesus hold special meaning for all Christians. Perhaps the following thoughts might add a special dimension to these events.

Simon, a Cyrenian, literally carried the cross of Jesus. When we read this account, can it not serve to remind us to take up our cross and follow Him? Can it not remind us that He depends on our help to carry out His will on earth (Mark 8:34)?

When we picture in our minds the outstretched, nailed hands and arms of Jesus, we can recall His words, "Come unto Me..." His arms are always open to receive us (Matthew 11:28).

The two thieves who were crucified with Jesus were situated, one on His right and one on His left. At the second coming, when He sits upon the throne of His glory, all nations will be separated one from another; the saved on His right and the lost on His left. This can be a reminder to be on the "right" side of Jesus (Matthew 25:33).

The cruel death Jesus suffered is an example to remind us that we too can face whatever type of death is in store for us. He will see us through it (*Hebrews 4:16*).

Jesus had the disciple whom He loved (John) to take His mother into John's own house. This is a lesson to us that, unlike Cain's question to the contrary, we are our brother's keeper. We have a charge to love and take care of the needs of our brethren (1 John 3:17).

The parting of Christ's garments can serve to remind us all not to be concerned about the material aspects of life. We must lay up for ourselves "treasure in heaven" (Matthew 6:19, 20).

The title Pilate wrote and put on the cross, JESUS OF NAZZARETH THE KING OF THE JEWS, should remind us daily that Jesus ". . . is King of kings and Lord of lords" (John 19:19; Revelation 19:16). We must honor Him and acknowledge His power always and in all ways.



UCAN City Mission is an Adult Male Rescue Mission seeking to serve "the least, the last and the lost" Providing men with:

- 1. A safe place to live
- 2. Life skills training
- 3. Health care and hygiene
- 4. Local Church connection & discipleship
- 5. Accountability
- 6. Recovery

UCAN is a fully staffed Gospel Rescue Mission that is led by a 12-member Board of Directors. They are also a member of Citygate Network (formerly the Association of Gospel Rescue Missions).

In early 2008 Chautauqua County community residents came together with the same vision. The members came from all walks of life; ministry, law enforcement, community members, business men and women, and agency providers. That group shared a vision of a stronger community created through Christian guidance, instruction, and support for ex-offenders. United Christian Advocacy Network (UCAN) was formed from the shared vision.

UCAN then began to engage and meet with county officials, town officials, law enforcement, zoning boards, educational institutions, churches and interested community members.

Through this discussion the community at large supported the need for this program in our area. A Board of Directors was formed and not-for-profit status was acquired for UCAN.

UCAN's initial desire was to establish a supportive transitional housing unit for males recently released from jail and prison. The housing program will work hand in hand with the day program. Lack of resources and funding had influenced the Board of Directors to switch gears and start with a day program because of the push from the community to start this program.

In January 2017, UCAN acquired the former Union Gospel Mission at 7 West First Street in Jamestown and we are now able to provide emergency housing for homeless men as well as temporary residence for those who desire to participate in our long-term programming.

On April 10, 2017, UCAN City Mission officially opened its doors, and through the generous donations and support of individuals, groups, churches, organizations, and businesses, we have been able to serve "the least, the last, and the lost" in this capacity ever since.
